ENJOY A SAFE AND HAPPY FOURTH OF JULY

When you think about the **Fourth of July**, you often think about delicious food, family, friends and fireworks. As stated in our Community documents, **fireworks**, other than sparklers, **are not to be discharged anywhere in Townhomes of West Lake**, **whether on private or common property**. Common property includes Fox Sparrow Road to Sheldon Road, as well as the area under the power lines. Sparklers may be used if the current County requirements permit their use, and the County is not in drought conditions.



Please be respectful of your neighbors. For some, fireworks can be a source of stress, especially for those who suffer from Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, also known as PTSD. In addition, the loud noise of fireworks can result in severe stress, fear, and anxiety for and children and pets and if ingested, unused fireworks are poisonous to pets.



Some local **Fourth of July** activities include downtown Tampa's Boom by the Bay, Riverwalk Inaugural Boat Parade, Lakeland's Red, White and Kaboom and Clearwater's Celebrate America at BayCare Ballpark. Safety Harbor Waterfront Park will host children's activities, food and entertainment with fireworks at 9 pm. Legoland and Busch Gardens also have fireworks displays.



IT'S THAT TIME AGAIN...

With an **active hurricane season predicted for 2021**, all of us need to be prepared and have a plan in the event a hurricane impacts our area. We've been lucky the past few years, but that doesn't mean our luck will hold. It is critical to make preparations to stay safe before, during and after the hurricane. Stock up on supplies and create emergency plans now: Disaster supply kit for 7 days, including food, water,

medicine, first aid supplies, batteries, cash, matches in a waterproof container, pet food, etc.

If a storm is imminent, remember to remove and store all furniture, plants, ornamentation, etc. from lanais, entry areas, etc. Park your car in the garage and remember to disengage the electric garage door opener. Use only the hurricane panels originally provided by the builder. Panels may be installed up to 72 hours prior to the expected arrival of the hurricane and must be removed no later than two weeks after the watch/warning is lifted. Sign up for Hillsborough County's mass notification system to keep informed. **Text StaySafe** to **888-777** or go to the HCFL Alert webpage to sign up now. If you are a Spectrum customer, the Spectrum News app Storm Season section is also a good resource.

It's That Time Again (Hurricane Preparedness) continued...

Every property is in a **flood zone**; however, risk varies.

Even though we are in **Zone X**, which is a low to moderate risk area, there is still a potential for ponding and local drainage issues during a major weather event. Just a few inches of water can cause thousands of dollars of damage! Homeowners insurance does not cover flood damage. Only flood insurance covers flood damage. Remember to inventory or take photos of all personal property prior to an event in order to document losses. Make sure to have your insurance information in a watertight portable location.
